



It's a day to enjoy various kinds of music. It's celebrated in more than 1,000 cities in about 120 countries. The countries include France, the U.S., Australia and India. Today, you can enjoy a variety of music in streets, parks and other public places. In various places, many free concerts are held for the audience.

Now, let's learn about the history of World Music Day. You may think it's a new event. Actually, the original idea of setting a day to celebrate music was suggested in France in 1976. Later, a survey showed that about 5 million people in France played a musical instrument. The number was about 9 percent of the population of the country at that time.
