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Taiheiji area is located near Ando Station on the Kintetsu Osaka Line. It is a community of old folk houses and narrow alleys in an old townscape. You can feel the historical atmosphere from the concrete cobblestone paths and Japanesestyle lights. There are also many famer's markets selling grapes near here, so it is the best place to walk around and take pictures.

# 88. Walkway With a View of Dokusho no Mori Floating on a Reservoir



The cobblestone pavement is reminiscent of a shrine approach and combined with the remaining old houses, it is a spot where you can experience the historic atmosphere of the town. In addition, the warm light overflowing from the streetlights shaped like lanterns creates an even more historic atmosphere at night.

Fujiidera Temple is a temple of the Omuro school of the Shingon sect of Buddhism. It is considered that "Senju Kannon" (Eleven-faced, Thousand-armed, Thousand-eyed Kanzeon Bodhisattva) is the oldest principal image in Japan. It will give people who visit peace of mind.

temple of the Tondabayashi Jinaimachi from the Sengoku
period. You can see the valuable historical townscape of

Konda Gobyoyama Kofun (Ojin Tenno-Ryo) is part of the Furuichi Kofun Group in Konda,
Habikino City in Osaka, and it is the tomb of the
15th Emperor Ojin. This huge keyhole-shaped
Kofun's burial mound length is 425m long, and
the height is 35m tall, so it is the largest volume in
Japan. There is a worship place in front of the
burial mound, and the lush greenery, white sand
and blue sky spread out beautifully.
In addition, the terrace lined with about 20,000
haniwa statues and the double moats are also
fascinating.

## 93. Hachibuseyama Nishimine Kofun Overlooking Osaka Plain, Where Both Ancient and Modern Coexist



## 94. Sayamaike Park Promenade to View the Sayamaike Water Intake Tower



Taishi Nagomi no Hiroba Square is built on the east of the Eifukuji Temple where the tomb of Prince Shotoku is located. This square preserves the historic scenery and is used to study the history and culture of Taishi Town. There are historical monuments and archaeological documents in many places, such as the Prince Shotoku Seventeen-article constitution stone monument, Matsuizuka Kofun sarcophagus which is designated as a cultural property of Osaka, and Amantani Kofun stone chamber, so you can feel the eternal history. The sunset seen from the square highlights Eifukuji Temple beautifully while painting the western sky bright red.

When you take a short walk on the road, you can see the historical townscape from the Sugidama (cedar balls) hanging from the eaves of the breweries, which are famous for Amano-sake.

# 100. Shimo-Akasaka Castle Ruins Overlooking the Shimo-Akasaka Terraced Rice Fields

Shimo-Akasaka Castle was built by KUSUNOKI Masashige and the terraced rice fields spreading out below offers the best scenery in Osaka as one of the "Top 100 Terraced Rice Fields in Japan." The terraced rice fields which spread out in a greenery hilly area show a different scenery in each season. It is very beautiful especially in the rice harvesting season.

Traditional local festivals and events are held around the Shimo-Akasaka Castle ruins, so you can feel the local culture and history.
