


View Spot Osaka Discovery & Sharing Project

Nominations for beautiful views of Osaka's world-class attractive, unique and colorful landscapes will be accepted from the public and chosen as **View Spot Osaka** locations. By sharing this information, we hope that the project will encourage both residents, entrepreneurs and visitors to become interested in the landscape, and help promote the beautification of Osaka's landscape. The first issue in 2019 introduced 28 view spots, and 26 spots were selected for the second issue in 2021.

This year, we held a third call for nominations and 26 out of 209 submissions were selected for this 3rd issue. There will be a final fourth call for submissions to make the list of spots 100.

This booklet introduces the newly selected 26 view spots. All locations have unique features in history, nature, infrastructure, etc. We hope that you will take some time to enjoy visiting them!





1 Mt. Myoken Seirei Terrace Overlooking Osaka Bay



661 Nomanaka, Nose Town/At Myokenguchi Station on the Nose Electric Railway Myoken Line, transfer to Hankyu Bus for 3 min to Cable Kurokawa Stop; transfer to Myoken no Mori Cable Line and after 5 min get off at Cable Sanjo Station; transfer to Myoken no Mori Lift and get off at Myokenyama Station after 10 min; get off, walk 10 min




Mt. Myoken is known as a world-famous sacred place for worshipping the North Star, and is a popular hiking spot where you can enjoy the scenery of each season. You can see Osaka Bay and Awaji Island from the Seirei Terrace.

2 Senrigawa River Bank for a View of Osaka International Airport and Landing/Departing Planes



Haradanaka, Toyonaka City/19 min walk from Sone Station on the Hankyu Takarazuka Line




See large aircrafts approaching the runway overhead and planes taking off into the air on the Senrigawa River Bank, bordering the southern end of Osaka International Airport. Visitors can also enjoy the natural beauty of the area throughout the day, such as the wide blue sky, the setting sun and the illumination of the runway guide lights.

3 Aigawa Dam Observation Spot to View the Dam



Daimonji, Ibaraki City/Take the Hankyu Kyoto Line for 22 min and transfer to Hankyu Bus at Ibarakishi Station, get off at Daimonkita Stop, then walk 10 min




The Aigawa Dam is a rare urban dam in the country and is currently under construction. The observation spot is open for a limited time, but it is a rare spot where you can see the dam without water. You can of course see the dam even after it is filled with water.

4 Former Ibarakigawa Green Space Overlooking the Greenery



7 Katagiricho, Ibaraki City/12 min walk from Ibarakishi Station on the Hankyu Kyoto Line




The Former Ibarakigawa River Green Space was created by filling Ibarakigawa River. It is now a recreational space that extends 5km vertically through downtown Ibaraki. Although it is in an urban area, the road is surrounded by greenery and provides a comfortable space.

5 Choshibashi Bridge Overlooking Minasegawa River and Hokusetsu Mountain Range



2-1 Todaiji, Shimamoto Town, Mishima County/15 min walk from Shimamoto Station on the JR Kyoto Line




Choshibashi Bridge is located in the southeastern part of Shimamoto Town. It is a spot where you can see both the Minasegawa River and Hokusetsu Mountain Range, which are valuable scenic resources.

6 View From Monorail Window Overlooking Bullet Trains



Aigawaminamimachi, Settsu City/Between Settsu Station and Minami-Settsu Station on the Osaka Monorail



You can see the bullet train depot from the window of the Osaka Monorail between Settsu Station and Minami-Settsu Station. There are very few places where you can see so many bullet trains at once. Not only children but also adults will surely be moved by this scenery.

1 Universal Studios Japan With a View of the Townscape Inside the Park




2-1-3 Sakurajima, Konohana Ward, Osaka City/5 min walk from Universal City Station on the JR Yumesaki Line



Universal Studios Japan is one of the six Universal Studios Theme Parks in the world. The townscape within the park will make you feel like you are in a foreign country.

2 Hachikenya River Station With a View of Tenjinbashi Bridge and Night Lights



1 Kitahamahirashi, Chuo Ward, Osaka City/3 min walk from Temmabashi Station on the Keihan Line



Hachikenya River Station is the first permanent river station in the Kansai region, and was created as a base for the exchange of people and things in Osaka, the water capital. The combination of Tenjinbashi's illuminations and night lights provides an exquisite view.

1 Kyokaido Road With a View of Hirakatashuku Kagiya Museum




Hirakatajuku was the 56th post town on the Tokaido Route, counting from Shinagawajuku. You can feel the atmosphere of the Kyokaido Road and post town, which flourished as a port for Yodogawa water transportation.

10 Tsutsumicho, Hirakata City/5 min walk from Hirakata Koen Station on the Keihan Line



2 Uchiagegawa River Flood Control Green Area for Cherry Blossom Viewing



This green area was built to adjust the flow rate of both the Neyagawa and Uchiagegawa Rivers during floods. An event with the illumination of 200 cherry blossom trees is held in the spring. You can enjoy the “Minamozakura,” which is a phenomenon that occurs when the cherry blossoms are reflected into the water, making them look like they are blooming upside down.


25 Sakuragaoka, Uzumasa, Neyagawa City/25 min walk from Neyagawashi Station on the Keihan Line



3 Kyokaido Road With a View of Bunroku Embankment and Moriguchijuku



2-5 Honmachi, Moriguchi City/3 min walk from Moriguchi Station on the Osaka Metro Tanimachi Line and 5 min walk from Moriguchishi Station on the Keihan Line




Toyotomi Hideyoshi ordered Mori Terumoto and others to build a land route on the left bank of the Yodogawa River that would connect Kyoto and Osaka in the shortest time. This is the embankment road called Kyokaido. Moriguchi City is the only place that has the remnants of the Bunroku Embankment.

4 Sunago Channel Side Road With a View of Cherry Blossoms Along the Waterway



6-1 Mitsushima, Kadoma City/16 min walk from Kadoma-minami Station on the Osaka Metro Nagahori Tsurumi-ryokuchi Line




Approximately 200 Yoshino cherry trees bloom every spring along the Sunago Channel running vertically across Mitsushima in Kadoma City. It is the best cherry blossom viewing spot in Kadoma, and its scenery has been selected as one of the 100 Best Greenery in Osaka.

5 Waterside Nature Garden With a View of Muroike Pond



Minamino, Shijonawate City/60 min walk from Shijonawate Station on the JR Gakkentoshi Line




The two promenades around Muroike Pond are located in the southern part of Muroike Park, which is popular as a waterside nature park. When you enter the area, you will be greeted by the open view of the pond surrounded by greenery. In autumn, the surrounding foliage changes color, making it even more beautiful.

6 Kyuhoji Jinaicho With a View of Kenshoji Temple Roof and Historical Townscape



5-2 Kyuhoji, Yao City/8 min walk from Kyuhoji Station on the JR Yamatoji Line




Kyuhoji Jinaicho was established in the late Muromachi Period as a temple town with Kenshoji Temple in the center. The town has a history of over 450 years. The grid-like layout remains almost unchanged since the Edo Period, and you will feel as if you returned to the past.

1 View Inside Izumi Recycle Environment Park



407-5 Nokecho, Izumi City/Transfer to the Nankai Bus at Izumicho Station on the Senboku Rapid Railway for 13 min, get off at Noke Stop, then walk 15 min



Izumi Recycle Environment Park has a variety of flowers for the four seasons, making it enjoyable for every season. Admission and parking are free, and the facility is barrier-free. It is a relaxing space full of nature that anyone can visit.

2 Izumiotsu Phoenix With a View of the Blue Sky and Mountains




Yunagicho, Izumiotsu City/45 min walk from Izumiotsu Station on the Nankai Main Line




Izumiotsu Phoenix/Hanshin Expressway/Prefectural Route 29/Izumiotsu Station/Satsuki Street/Prefectural Route 204

Izumiotsu Phoenix is a reclaimed land created from industrial waste through the Osaka Bay Phoenix Plan and it has also become a venue for many events. The surrounding area is open, so you can get away from being surrounded by man-made objects every day and enjoy the blue sky and mountains.

3 Kumeda Pond Promenade With a View of Cherry Blossoms



Ikejiricho, Kishiwada City/18 min walk from Kumeda Station on the JR Hanwa Line




Kumeda Pond is an agricultural water/fish pond with the largest water area in the prefecture. Many cherry blossoms are planted along the promenade, and many visitors come day and night to see the cherry blossoms when they are in full bloom in early April.

4 Kaizuka Jinaicho With a View of Gansenji Temple



6 Nakamachi, Kaizuka City/4 min walk from Kaizuka Station on the Nankai Main Line




Kaizuka Jinaicho is a village that was formed around Buddhist temples and gobos (dojos) from the Muromachi to the early Edo periods. The main hall of Gansenji Temple, the center of the temple, has been designated as an important cultural property along with the front gate and drum hall.

5 Yamanakadani Old Kaido Road With a View of the Townscape




Yamanakadani, Hannan City/3 min walk from Yamanakadani Station on the JR Hanwa Station



The “Kumano Kaido” road that flourished as a pilgrimage site to Kumano runs through Yamanakadani. This road was used by the Kishu Tokugawa Lord and was also called the Kishu Kaido. There are still buildings that have a historic atmosphere, and is a spot where you can feel as if you traveled back in time.

6 Slope in the Residential Area of “Hakonoura” Overlooking the Sea



Hakonoura, Hannan City/26 min walk from Hakotsukuri Station on the Nankai Main Line




The scenery of the slope leading from the residential area of Hakonoura to the sea of Sennan Satoumi Park is a perfect spot where you can feel Hannan City by the sea.

7 Nagamatsu Natural Coast With a View of the Sunset



Tannowa, Misaki Town, Sennan County/12 min walk from Misakikoen Station on the Nankai Main Line




The Nagamatsu Natural Coast in Misaki Town is a gently curving 850m coastline. Walk along the Waterside Road in the sunset to enjoy the spectacular view of Kansai International Airport, Akashi Kaikyo Bridge, and Kitan Strait.

1 Narrow Streets in the Taiheiji Temple Area with a View of the Cobblestone Pavement and Dim Streetlights



2-10 Taiheiji, Kashiwara City/8 min walk from Ando Station on the Kintetsu Osaka Line



The Taiheiji Temple area is a community of old folk houses near Ando Station on the Kintetsu Osaka Line, with narrow alleys lined with historical buildings. You will feel the historical atmosphere of the cobblestone paths and Japanese-style lighting.

2 Walkway With a View of the Floating Dokushonomori Library in a Reservoir



3-1 Taijo, Matsubara City/3 min walk from Takaminosato Station on the Kintetsu Minami Osaka Line



The Dokushonomori is a library that looks like an ancient tomb, and has won various awards including the 2020 Good Design Award. You can see the library nestled in the reservoir from the walkway near the library.

3 Oura Farm With a View of Rice Terraces



99-1 Kanomotominami, Kanan Town, Minamikawachi County/Take the Kintetsu Nagano Line for 17 minutes to Tondabayashi Station, transfer to Kongo Bus and get off at Kikusuien-mae Stop, then walk a short distance



If you look to the southwest from Oura Farm, you will see a beautiful landscape of rice terraces. This photo was taken from a cabin on the grounds of Oura Farm.

4 Koya Kaido Road With a View of the Sake Brewery Townscape




12 Naganocho, Kawachinagano City/4 min walk from Kawachinagano Station on the Nankai Takano Line




Koya Kaido is a road used to access Mt. Koya from Kyoto and Osaka, and runs right next to Kawachinagano Station. If you take short walk along the road from the station, you will see cedar ball hanging from the eaves of the brewery famous for Amano sake.

5 Summit of Mt. Iwawaki With a View Over Grass of Mt. Kongo Floating in a Sea of Clouds




Takihata, Kawachinagano City/Take the Nankai Koya line for 50 min and transfer to Nankai Bus at Kawachinagano Station, get off at the Takihata Dam stop, walk 150 min



Mt. Iwawaki is one of the “New 100 Famous Mountains in Japan.” It is known for its expansive view at the grass covered summit. When the grass on the summit is in bloom, fog also forms. A sea of clouds may appear at sunrise over the grass on the mountaintop.
