After a stroke or a traffic accident, have you experienced any of the following symptoms?

- Difficulty speaking
- Trouble adapting to situations
- Increased irritability
- Strong fixation on certain things
- Poor planning or organization
- Easily distracted
- Forgetting appointments
- Spaced out or inattentive

These may be signs of Higher Brain Dysfunction.

Higher brain dysfunction refers to a condition where brain functions such as memory, attention, thinking, language, emotions, and behavior are impaired due to damage caused by illness or accident. This condition can lead to various difficulties in daily and social life. Because the symptoms are not always visible, it may be hard for others to understand.
